Lessons to Learn from Animals A-Z

The Bible mentions **over 120 species of animals**, with some sources estimating approximately **125 animals** in total. These include various creatures referenced throughout the Old and New Testaments.

As one reads through their Bible they will come across statements that point the reader to check out how an animal

lived or to the actions that an animal would take.

For example, **Jesus** used animals to teach important lessons:

Matt. 6:25 "Therefore I say to you, do not worry about your life, what you will eat or what you will drink; nor about your body, what you will put on. Is not life more than food and the body more than clothing?

26 "Look at the birds of the air, for they neither sow nor reap nor gather into barns; yet your heavenly Father feeds them. Are you not of more value than they?

In Matthew 10:16 He stated, "Behold, I send you out as sheep in the midst of wolves.

Therefore be wise as <u>serpents</u> and harmless as <u>doves</u>.

Matthew 10:29 "Are not two **sparrows** sold for a copper coin (think two pennies)? And not one of them falls to the ground apart from your Father's will. 30 "But the very hairs of your head are all numbered.

31 "Do not fear therefore; you are of more value than many **sparrows**.

Matthew 23:23 "Woe to you, scribes and Pharisees, hypocrites!.... 24 You blind guides, straining out a **gnat** and swallowing a **came!**!

Solomon used animals to teach life principles. In Proverbs 6:6 he admonished the Sluggard to go to an <u>ant</u>: "Go to the ant, you sluggard! Consider her ways and be wise." 7 Which, having no captain, Overseer or ruler, 8 Provides her supplies in the summer, *And* gathers her food in the harvest.

Proverbs 17:12 "Let a man meet a **bear** robbed of her cubs, Rather than a fool in his folly.

Proverbs 26:11 As a **dog** returns to his own vomit, *So* a fool repeats his folly. Proverbs 26:17 Whoever meddles in a quarrel not his own is like one who takes a passing dog by the ears.

(Ex 11:7 'But against none of the children of Israel shall a **dog** move its tongue, against man or beast, that you may know that the LORD does make a difference between the Egyptians and Israel.')

((Judges 7:5 So he brought the people down to the water. And the LORD said to Gideon, "Everyone who laps from the water with his tongue, as a **dog** laps, you shall set apart by himself;)

Proverbs 19:12 The king's wrath *is* like the roaring of a <u>lion</u>, But his favor *is* like dew on the grass.

Proverbs 20:2 The wrath of a king *is* like the roaring of a <u>lion</u>; *Whoever* provokes him to anger sins *against* his own life.

Proverbs 22:13 The lazy *man* says, "*There is* a <u>lion</u> outside! I shall be slain in the streets!"

Proverbs 26:13 The lazy *man* says, "*There is* a <u>lion</u> in the road! A fierce <u>lion</u> is in the streets!"

Proverbs 28:1 The wicked flee when no one pursues, But the righteous are bold as a **lion**.

Proverbs 28:15 *Like* a roaring <u>lion</u> and a charging <u>bear</u> *Is* a wicked ruler over poor people.

Proverbs 30:29 *There are three* things which are majestic in stride, Yes, four which are stately in walk:

30 A <u>lion</u>, which is mighty among beasts And does not turn away from any; 31 A <u>greyhound</u>, A male <u>goat</u> also, And a king whose troops are with him.

God uses animals to describe us:

Ps 95:7 For He is our God, And we are the people of His pasture, And the **sheep** of His hand. Today, if you will hear His voice:

Ps 100:3 Know that the LORD, He is God; It is He who has made us, and not we ourselves; We are His people and the **sheep of His pasture**.

In Prov. 30 Solomon used the wisdom of four animal to teach us about life.

- Prov. 30:24 There are four things which are little on the earth, But they are exceedingly wise:
- 25 The <u>ants</u> are a people not strong, Yet they prepare their food in the summer;
- 26 The <u>conies</u> (rock badgers) are a feeble folk, Yet they make their homes in the crags;
- 27 The <u>locusts</u> have no king, Yet they all advance in ranks;
- 28 The <u>spider</u> skillfully grasps with its hands, And it is in kings' palaces.

Lessons from ANTS

- Prov. 6:6 Go to the ant, you sluggard! Consider her ways and be wise, 7 Which, having no captain, Overseer or ruler, 8 Provides her supplies in the summer, *And* gathers her food in the harvest.
- Proverbs 30:25 The ants *are* a people not strong, Yet they prepare their food in the summer:

Principle Lesson: <u>Preparation</u> with Diligence. Thinks and plans ahead while working hard today.

Preparation quotes: "Preparation Precedes Performance."

- "A winning effort begins with preparation." Joe Gibbs
- "Before everything else getting ready is the secret to success." Henry Ford
- "Preparedness is the key to success and victory." General Douglas MacArthur
- "I will get ready and then perhaps my chance will come." Abraham Lincoln Failure to prepare is preparing to fail!
 - Today's <u>actions</u> determine tomorrow's <u>achievements</u>.

Preparation's value: It gives us content. It gives us confidence. It gives us credibility.

Lesson from the **CONIES** or rock badgers

Proverbs 30:26 The conies are but a feeble folk, yet they make their houses in the rocks:

Psalms 104:18 The high hills are a refuge for the wild goats, and the rocks for the conies.

Principle lesson: They <u>protect</u> what is most valuable, which is their life!!!! We must know our enemy and we must know our weaknesses. Do not put yourself in places where you are prone to fall. Build adequate shelter for protection.

1 Peter 5:8 Be sober-minded; be watchful. (Be ALERT - Your adversary, the devil, prowls around like a roaring lion, seeking someone to devour. (He is poised to pounce)

Lesson from Locust

Prov.30 27 The locusts have no king, Yet they all advance in ranks;

Principle lesson – Locust are smart enough that even though they have no leader they advance because of teamwork. They value Partnership. They value **cooperation**.

God revealed the power of cooperation in Gen. 11:6 when He stated "Indeed the people are **one** and they all have one language, and this is what they begin to do; now nothing that they propose to do will be withheld from them.

Teamwork makes the dream work! One is too small a number to produce greatness. TEAM – Together Each Accomplishes More

Lesson from the **Spider**.

Prov. 30:28 The spider skillfully grasps with its hands, And it is in kings' palaces.

Principle lesson: I see a spider as one with great <u>Imagination</u>. They are creative. They get to places many feel are unattainable. It makes the most of <u>small</u> opens to get to <u>large</u> places.

Some other value lessons from a variety of animals spoken of in the Bible – and a few not in the Bible.

Lesson from the **BIRDS**.

• Matt. 6:25 ¶ "Therefore I say to you, do not worry about your life, what you will eat or what you will drink; nor about your body, what you will put on. Is not life more than food and the body more than clothing? 26 "Look at the birds of the air, for they neither sow nor reap nor gather into barns; yet your heavenly Father feeds them. Are you not of more value than they?

Principle Lesson: **God is my <u>provider</u>**. There are things in life that are not worth worrying about.

Butterfly - it is the pain that produces the strength –

Camels – they are associated with a story of how one becomes extraordinary – Gen. 24:12 Then he said, "O LORD God of my master Abraham, please give me success this day, and show kindness to my master Abraham. 13 "Behold, *here* I stand by the well of water, and the daughters of the men of the city are coming out to draw

water. 14 "Now let it be that the young woman to whom I say, 'Please let down your pitcher that I may drink,' and she says, 'Drink, **and I will also give your camels a drink'** — *let* her *be the one* You have appointed for Your servant Isaac. And by this I will know that You have shown kindness to my master."

- 15 And it happened, before he had finished speaking, that behold, Rebekah, came out with her pitcher on her shoulder. 16 Now the young woman *was* very beautiful to behold, a virgin; no man had known her. And she went down to the well, filled her pitcher, and came up. 17 And the servant ran to meet her and said, "Please let me drink a little water from your pitcher."
- 18 So she said, "Drink, my lord." Then she quickly let her pitcher down to her hand, and gave him a drink.
- 19 And when she had finished giving him a drink, she said, "I will draw water for your camels also, until they have finished drinking." 20 Then she quickly emptied her pitcher into the trough, ran back to the well to draw water, and drew for all his camels.

Rebekah did extra with the ordinary and became extraordinary and it changed everything for her!

From CATTLE

Psalm 50:7 "Hear, O my people, and I will speak; O Israel, I will testify against you. I am God, your God.

- 8 Not for your sacrifices do I rebuke you; your burnt offerings are continually before me.

Lessons from the Animal Kingdom	

Lesson from the **DEER**

2 Samuel 22:34 He makes my feet like the *feet* of deer, And sets me on my high places.

Psalms 18:33 He makes my feet like the *feet of* deer, And sets me on my high places. Habakkuk 3:19 The LORD God is my <u>strength</u>; He will make my feet like deer's *feet*, And He will make me walk on my high hills.

2 Samuel 22:37 You enlarged my path under me; So my feet did not slip.

Principle lesson: God brings to my life <u>security</u>. He makes me able to stand even in the difficult times of life. Knowing that God is my strength, I will be able to attain the high places He has desired for me.

Prayer: Psalms 17:5 Uphold my steps in **Your paths**, *That* my footsteps may not slip.

Lesson from the **Eagles**

Proverbs 30:18-19 There are three *things which* are too wonderful for me, Yes, four *which* I do not understand: The way of an eagle in the air,

Eagles were used to demonstrate God's power.

• Exodus 19:4 'You have seen what I did to the Egyptians, and *how* I bore you on eagles' wings and brought you to Myself.

Eagles are used to demonstrate how we have renewed power when we wait on the LORD.

- Isaiah 40:31 But those who wait on the LORD Shall renew *their* strength; They shall mount up with wings like eagles, They shall run and not be weary, They shall walk and not faint.
- Psalms 103:2, 5 Bless the LORD, O my soul, And forget not all His benefits:......Who satisfies your mouth with good *things, So that* your youth is renewed like the eagle's.

Side lesson from the eagle for PARENTS - Stir up the nest – Deut. 32:11 **As an eagle stirs up its nest**, Hovers over its young, Spreading out its wings, taking them up, Carrying them on its wings,

Lessons from circus ELEPHANTS.

As a baby elephant the elephant is tied to a stake in the ground strong enough to hold the elephant. It cannot break free. As it gets larger the same chain and stake hold the elephant because it the memory of an elephant is set. It continues to believe what happened in the past is true today.

We many time remember our past and it blocks our future. We remember things told to us by others and though we have grown up we still believe those statements. Don't stay tied to your **past**.

Lesson from the **Fox**

SOS 2:15 Catch us the foxes, The little foxes that spoil the vines, For our vines *have* tender grapes.

Principle lesson: A bright future can be ruined by something very small so be on guard and capture the things that will destroy.

2 Corinthians 10: 3 For though we walk in the flesh, we do not war according to
the flesh .4 For the weapons of our warfare are not carnal but mighty in God for
pulling down strongholds, 5 casting down arguments and every high thing
that exalts itself against the knowledge of God, bringing every thought into
captivity to the obedience of Christ,

You better control your thinking if you want to stay victorious.

Lesson from the GEESE -

Geese fly in a formation that allows for them to cut through the wind easier. The one's at the back honk out **encouragement** to the one's up front.

They also rotate having each goose serve as the lead goose. No one goose has to do all the hard work of cutting through the air.

We all need encouragement as we lead – we need to **give** encouragement to those who are leading.

What works better – compliments or criticism?

Lesson from the **Grasshoppers**

Numbers 13:33 "There we saw the giants (the descendants of Anak came from the giants); and we were like grasshoppers in our own sight, and so we were in their sight."

What is the problem in Numbers 13:33?

"There we saw the giants (the descendants of Anak came from the giants); and we were like grasshoppers <u>in our own sight</u>, and so we were in their sight."

Principle Lesson: I must have a spiritually healthy Self Image of myself.

- If you cannot see yourself doing it you will not do it.

You have to ask yourself: What do you see in the mirror?

It is so important to see yourself the way God sees you.

Take test. Know Thyself. Know your strengths. Know God's strength.

Lesson from the Goldfish.

You are being watched and the places to hide are very few.

We should have a Phil. 4:8-9 mindset and lifestyle.

Phil. 4:8 Finally, brethren, whatever things are true, whatever things are noble, whatever things are just, whatever things are pure, whatever things are lovely, whatever things are of good report, if there is any virtue and if there is anything praiseworthy—meditate on these things. 9 The things which you learned and received and heard and saw in me, these do, and the God of peace will be with you.

Lifestyle teaches more than lips.

Lesson from the Horse

Psalms 147:10 He (God) does not delight in the <u>strength</u> of the horse; He takes no pleasure in the legs of a man.

- Psalms 33:17 A horse *is* a vain hope for safety; Neither shall it deliver *any* by its great strength.
- Proverbs 21:31 The horse *is* prepared for the day of battle, But <u>deliverance</u> *is* of the LORD.

Principle lesson: Be Careful that you do not put your trust in things that will fail you.

For instance - money - 1 Timothy 6:17 Command those who are rich in this present age not to be haughty, nor to trust in uncertain riches but in the living God, who gives us richly all things to enjoy.

Your money rebukes you – Does not say IN THIS GOD WE TRUST says IN GOD WE TRUST

Horse

Jeremiah 12:5 "If you have run with the footmen, and they have wearied you, Then how can you contend with horses? And *if* in the land of peace, *In which* you trusted, *they wearied you*, Then how will you do in the floodplain of the Jordan?

Psalms 32:9 Do not be like the horse *or* like the mule, *Which* have no understanding, Which must be harnessed with bit and bridle, Else they will not come near you.

Psalms 33:17 A horse *is* a vain hope for safety; Neither shall it deliver *any* by its great strength.

Psalms 76:6 At Your rebuke, O God of Jacob, Both the chariot and horse were cast into a dead sleep.

Psalms 147:10 He does not delight in the strength of the horse; He takes no pleasure in the legs of a man.

Proverbs 21:31 The horse *is* prepared for the day of battle, But deliverance *is* of the LORD.

Proverbs 26:3 A whip for the horse, A bridle for the donkey, And a rod for the fool's back

Lesson from Jellyfish – Don't bring into my life things that destroy it.

Lesson from the Lion tamer with a lion

The four legs causes the lion to be paralyzed - cannot focus on but one thing – because of the four legs it does not know what to focus on

You cannot do everything! Over commitment leads to less commitment!

Lion -

Pr 19:12 The king's wrath *is* as the roaring of a **lion**; but his favour *is* as dew upon the grass.

Pr 20:2 The fear of a king *is* as the roaring of a <u>lion</u>: *whoso* provoketh him to anger sinneth *against* his own soul.

Pr 22:13 The slothful *man* saith, *There is* a **lion** without, I shall be slain in the streets.

Pr 26:13 The slothful *man* saith, *There is* a <u>lion</u> in the way; a <u>lion</u> is in the streets.

Pr 28:1 The wicked flee when no man pursueth: but the righteous are bold as a <u>lion</u>.

Pr 28:15 As a roaring **lion**, and a ranging bear; so is a wicked ruler over the poor people.

Pr 30:30 A lion which is strongest among beasts, and turneth not away for any;

Lesson from the MULE

Psalms 32:9 Do not be like the horse *or* like the mule, *Which* have no understanding, Which must be **harnessed** with **bit** and **bridle**, Else they will not come near you.

Principle lesson: Don't be <u>Stubborn</u>. Be <u>teachable</u>. Be flexible. Be agreeable.

Lesson from Pigs

• Luke 15:15 "Then he went and joined himself to a citizen of that country, and he sent him into his fields to feed swine. "And he would gladly have filled his stomach with the pods that the swine ate, and no one gave him *anything*.

The pigpen is where the devil wants you to live.

You should remember that sin will take you further than you want to go; cost you more than you want to pay and keep you longer than you want to stay.

Lessons from the Rabbits – if you chase two rabbits BOTH will get away.

Lesson from the **Ravens – crows**.

Psalms 147:9 He giveth to the beast his food and to the young ravens which cry.

• Job 38:41 Who provides food for the raven, When its young ones cry to God, And wander about for lack of food?

Principle lesson: They remind us of the power of <u>prayer</u>. They cry for food and God hears them and answers them. God is able to meet our needs and He is willing to meet our needs.

Psalm 50:7 "Hear, O my people, and I will speak; O Israel, I will testify against you. I am God, your God.

- 8 Not for your sacrifices do I rebuke you; your burnt offerings are continually before me.

Who has redness of eyes? 30 Those who linger long at the wine, Those who go in search of mixed wine. 31 Do not look on the wine when it is red, When it sparkles in the cup, When it swirls around smoothly; 32 At the last it bites like a serpent, And stings like a viper. 33 Your eyes will see strange things, And your heart will utter perverse things. 34 Yes, you will be like one who lies down in the midst of the sea, Or like one who lies at the top of the mast, saying: 35 "They have struck me, but I was not hurt; They have beaten me, but I did not feel it. When shall I awake, that I may seek another drink?"

- There are things that seem <u>bad</u> for you but in the end <u>help</u> you.
- There are things that seem good for you but in the end harm you.

Lesson from Wolves.

- Ezekiel 22:27 "Her <u>princes</u> in her midst are like wolves tearing the prey, to shed blood, to destroy people, and to get dishonest gain.
- Zephaniah 3:3 Her princes in her midst are roaring lions; Her <u>judges</u> are evening wolves That leave not a bone till morning.
- Matthew 7:15 "Beware of false prophets, who come to you in sheep's clothing, but inwardly they are ravenous wolves.
- Acts 20:29 "For I know this, that after my departure savage wolves will come in among you, not sparing the flock.

Principle lesson: Everything is not as it appears. Beware of false prophets. One indicator is that they like to <u>profit</u> as a prophet.

Leadership is about serving – not being served!

Genesis 24:64 Then Rebekah lifted her eyes, and when she saw Isaac she dismounted from her camel;

Genesis 31:34 Now Rachel had taken the household idols, put them in the camel's saddle, and sat on them. And Laban searched all about the tent but did not find *them*. Leviticus 11:4 'Nevertheless these you shall not eat among those that chew the cud or those that have cloven hooves: the camel, because it chews the cud but does not have cloven hooves, is unclean to you;

Deuteronomy 14:7 "Nevertheless, of those that chew the cud or have cloven hooves, you shall not eat, *such as* these: the camel, the hare, and the rock hyrax; for they chew the cud but do not have cloven hooves; they *are* unclean for you.

1 Samuel 15:3 'Now go and attack Amalek, and utterly destroy all that they have, and do not spare them. But kill both man and woman, infant and nursing child, ox and sheep, camel and donkey."

2 Kings 8:9 So Hazael went to meet him and took a present with him, of every good thing of Damascus, forty camel-loads; and he came and stood before him, and said, "Your son Ben-Hadad king of Syria has sent me to you, saying, 'Shall I recover from this disease?'"

No verse If a camel gets it's nose in your tent it will go all the way through Sin will take me further than I want to go cost me more than I want to pay and stay longer than I want it to stay.

COW

Leviticus 22:28 "Whether it is a cow or ewe, do not kill both her and her young on the same day.

Numbers 18:17 "But the firstborn of a cow, the firstborn of a sheep, or the firstborn of a goat you shall not redeem; they *are* holy. You shall sprinkle their blood on the altar, and burn their fat *as* an offering made by fire for a sweet aroma to the LORD.

Job 21:10 Their bull breeds without failure; Their cow calves without miscarriage.

Isaiah 7:21 It shall be in that day *That* a man will keep alive a young cow and two sheep;

Isaiah 11:7 The cow and the bear shall graze; Their young ones shall lie down together; And the lion shall eat straw like the ox.

Ezekiel 4:15 Then He said to me, "See, I am giving you cow dung instead of human waste, and you shall prepare your bread over it."

COWS

Genesis 32:15 thirty milk camels with their colts, forty cows and ten bulls, twenty female donkeys and ten foals.

Genesis 41:2 Suddenly there came up out of the river seven cows, fine looking and fat; and they fed in the meadow.

Genesis 41:3 Then behold, seven other cows came up after them out of the river, ugly and gaunt, and stood by the *other* cows on the bank of the river.

Genesis 41:4 And the ugly and gaunt cows ate up the seven fine looking and fat cows. So Pharaoh awoke.

Genesis 41:18 "Suddenly seven cows came up out of the river, fine looking and fat; and they fed in the meadow.

Genesis 41:19 "Then behold, seven other cows came up after them, poor and very ugly and gaunt, such ugliness as I have never seen in all the land of Egypt.

Genesis 41:20 "And the gaunt and ugly cows ate up the first seven, the fat cows.

Genesis 41:26 "The seven good cows *are* seven years, and the seven good heads *are* seven years; the dreams *are* one.

Genesis 41:27 "And the seven thin and ugly cows which came up after them *are* seven years, and the seven empty heads blighted by the east wind are seven years of famine.
